Lesson 4: Technologies of Distance Education

Distance Education uses different technologies. Print Based Corresponding Studying, Prerecorded Media, One-Way Live Video, Two-Way Audio-One -Way Video, and Two-Way Audio-Video are all forms of distance education used by institutions. As new technologies as emerged new ways of distributing learning materials have been created. Blackboard, Canvas, Moodle, Google Classroom, Edmodo, and Moodle offer good platforms for the distribution of instructional and learning materials. The video did not mention Google Classroom and Edmodo, but I thought it was important to bring up the two most used platforms by K-12 educators.
